That same presence is what delivers the Season of Epiphany to us. Epiphany means "manifestation." The Christ, the Good News, is brought directly to us and among us. Maybe we will see it in the magi's adoration of the Christ child, at Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River, and at his first miracle, in which he changes water into wine. All three of these "epiphanies" come with energy and exuberance, they are a celebration of something new and exciting combined with the finding again something we always knew.

These stories are raw and real—they are exciting and open the mind and soul to all sorts of new possibilities. Not unlike an adorable five-year old saying a prayer for her extended family for the first time.

So follow up the good news and great joy of Christmas with the season of Epiphany here at St. James Church. We'll have our Christmas / Epiphany Pageant, which is actually on the Day of Epiphany this year, which is very cool. Giobal Lutheran Outreach from everywhere to everywhere

Ben Tino, the nephew of St. James Church member Carol Nadasen, is serving in Guatamala. Here are some clips from his latest update:

MY WORK as the music director and missionary is keeping me plenty busy. All throughout the week I am teaching music lessons to church members and non-church members, who I pray will eventually find God. Also, rehearsals for Christmas programs have begun and I pray that everything will run smoothly for my first Christmas here. Conectado con Cristo 2018: "Connected with Christ" was the theme for this years National Youth Gathering of Guatemala which happened last weekend, December 7th-9th. In attendance were close to 100 youth from the nine different Lutheran Churches in Guatemala. The weekend was spent in the mountainous city of Totonicapán (10 hr drive west from Zacapa) at a retreat center where we spent three days interacting with other youth, playing games, worshipping together, and learning more about Jesus. From Zacapa were 18 youth who participated this year, and we all had a blast running off of no sleep and experiencing very cold temperatures that are common in that part of the country.





Apple-A-Day: January is Thyroid Awareness Month

The thyroid is a butterfly shaped gland located in the base of the neck just below the Adam's apple. Though small this gland plays a big role influencing the proper functioning of the heart, brain, skin, liver and kidneys. Your thyroid gland is like a car engine that controls the pace at which your body functions. Untreated thyroid disease may lead to high cholesterol, heart disease, infertility, and osteoporosis.

lodine is the fuel your body extracts from salt and food to make the two hormones, T3 and T 4 which regulate almost every cell, tissue and organ in the body. If your thyroid produces too much hormone, body systems speed up(hyperthyroidism) or if your body produces too little hormone your body systems slow down (hypothyroidism).

Thyroid disease is more common than diabetes or heart disease. Thyroid disease effects as many as 30 million Americans. Research shows a genetic link to thyroid disease and other autoimmune diseases such as diabetes, arthritis and anemia.

If you have any family members with thyroid disease, are over the age of 60, or have any symptoms of thyroid disease ask your doctor about the TSH test for thyroid disease. The best way to be sure you don not have thyroid disease is have your doctor test your blood for TSH or Thyroid Stimulating Hormone.


