A WORD from Pastor Paul

"Sing to the Lord a new song! Sing to the Lord all the Earth!...

Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice; Let the sea roar, and all that fills it; let the field exalt and everything in it."

From Psalm 96

I learned something about a famous recording artist this week. Formerly (and again later) known as "Prince," he had no other musicians than himself to produce his albums. He recorded himself playing other instruments in the studio and he achieved a wonderful sound by superimposing the tracks on one another. I thought to myself, "This must have been exhausting! He's playing every instrument."
