A WORD from Pastor Abby

Advent greetings, beloved St. James community -

Hidden in this season are little traditions of cultures worldwide, like that of St. Lucia Day. As a kid, I loved this day. I'd pop out of bed, Swedish heritage pumping like adrenaline, and smash the itchy, candle-clad wreath over my blond braids. My early-rising mom was shooed back to bed so I could properly complete the tradition of serving one's parents breakfast. Then, with my tray of goodies and matching American Girl doll, Kirsten, I'd travel about; from church elder to godparents to school classroom, sharing a sweet surprise. Sentimental or silly as it may be, I still dress each year.

If this all sounds very foreign and strange, quick history lesson: Saint Lucia was a 3rd century Christian woman, born in Sicily. Deeply devoted to her faith, she gave her entire inheritance to feed poor Christians, much to the chagrin of her appointed fiancé. He took her to court and sentenced her to death. The story of St. Lucia's martyrdom traveled north and resonated greatly with the Scandinavians. Lucia, which means "light," was a joyful image contrasting their long, cold, dark winters and legends of sighting spread through Sweden. It was said that she wore a crown of candles to light her way and free up her hands to do more good work. On December 13 in Sweden, eldest daughters will continue the tradition and towns will host grand festivals to remember St. Lucia.

The story of St. Lucia carries a message of light coming into the darkness. For some, it is a story that celebrates community and tradition. For all, it is a story that speaks to faithfulness and kindness.
