



A WORD FROM PASTOR ABBY

ˈsākrəd/ adj.

- 1. connected with God for a special purpose
- 2. dedicated or set apart for religious worship
 - 3. holy; deserving of veneration

Dear beloved community of St. James,

I love mugs, handmade especially. The collection in my cupboard reminds me of the places I call home or potter's I've befriended. This time of year, as we begin anew and start each day with that January chill, nothing beats the morning ritual of filling a mug with hot coffee.

And I believe mugs are sacred things. When invited to an intimate space, they tangibly embody the essence of the intangible; warmth, permanence, beholding, whatever is most needed. They bring us back to our bodies by touch and smell and taste. Hands - such busy creatures - are quieted gently. When a heart is sore or a mind is tried, an empathetic offering of a mug can soothe. A mug is not a thing of the road or movement but an object of home and of somewhere settled. A teacup is can be formal but a mug is casually relatable. It is just itself and content so. Mugs can be diplomats and peace treaties. They can be mediators and healers of worn relationships - relationships with someone else, with ourselves, with the Spirit. We hold mugs and somehow, gracefully, become held, too.

We believe our God is Love. If there is Love in a space, it is the Spirit present. To connect and care for ourselves and for others in Love is to join in worship of God. And if that seems too simple, that such an ordinary object as a mug can be sacred, think of the ordinary man who took ordinary ingredients on a table. He blessed them and used them for profound purposes, a meal we are still invited to attend, in order to reveal his extraordinary nature and his extraordinary Love.

I look forward to sharing the sacred space of warm mugs and thoughtful conversation with you this winter. Stop by during office hours for a coffee or tea, a snuggle from Thule, or just some time to share presence. Each simple day is sacred, each "clink" of mugs is a sound of welcome.

Covid 19- Booster Shot versus Third Dose(Additional Dose)

There is a difference between the Covid Booster and the Covid19 third shot(Additional Dose). The

Covid third dose is a third dose of the same series (i.e. Moderna or Pfizer) for people whose immune systems because of comorbidities or chronic disease states that are unable to mount a strong immune response to the Covid 19 vaccine. It is typically a full dose of vaccine. Examples of people in this category are those receiving chemotherapy, with HIV, received an organ transplant, people with chronic immunosuppressive therapy such as chronic prednisone therapy. A person who falls into this category can receive a third dose 28 days after their second shot.

The Covid booster is a third shot given to boost immunity as it starts to wane in a normal immune system. Sometimes it is only a half dose of the original vaccine (Moderna). Boosters are readily available to all ages over 16, more recently because of the spread of the new variant, Omnicron.

Booster shots are found to reduce more severe illness, hospitalizations and death. Boosters are recommended for the J and J vaccine after two months, and Moderna or Pfizer after six months.
