# Apple A Day:

# March, Why Omicron Probably Is Not the End of Covid-19

Many people in and out of the medical community were hopeful that omicron being so contagious would bring about a greater degree of immunity even for the unvaccinated. Some vaccine specialists

were hoping omicron would provide herd immunity. The World Health Organization has promoted the idea that Omicron would promote widespread immunity through the combination of people with vaccinations and infections.

A University of California study published January 26<sup>th</sup> purports herd immunity brought about by Omicron is a "long shot". Fully vaccinated people after break though infections of Omicron versus Delta variant; Omicron produced lower levels of immunity even though it is more transmissible; Delta produced stronger hybrid immunity when combining vaccination and infection. Omicron was compared to "upper respiratory" viruses like a cold virus. Their conclusion was Omicron will not produce long lasting immunity making people, especially the unvaccinated vulnerable to the next variant.

So where will the next wave come from? What will it look like? Most experts say at this point they don't know. The Delta rose out of an unvaccinated population in India early 2021. Omicron started in an unvaccinated population in South Africa at the end of 2021. One medical expert says "Mother Nature" will continue to hurl variants at us especially when the world's poorer nations in Africa, Asia and Latin America remain unvaccinated.

The vaccine remains the most reliable, safest source of immunity. Even if you have been infected with Covid a booster shot is recommended.

The word acolyte is derived from the Greek word akolouthos, meaning companion, attendant, or helper, who waits continually upon another: a follower. The Acolyte ministry has its roots in the Old Testament of the Holy Bible, where the prophet Samuel is seen assisting Eli, the Levite priest, and Elisha is seen assisting Elijah the Prophet.

Today, acolytes continue to assist the pastor through their service in lighting candles, distributing and receiving back the offering plates, collecting the individual cups during communion, and other duties as necessary. They are important participants in worship and perform vital tasks.

# A WORD from Pastor Abby

Greetings beloved community of St. James,

Two weeks ago, I walked into the halls of the Frick Art Museum in New York City. I stared into the painted faces of many people. Different decades, different dress, but all resigned to a single position, one look for their days on display. Then, I looked around at the living faces of many people walking about. As they paused at one painting and walking to the next, their faces moved and changed. You could tell when they liked some paintings, others made them uncomfortable, still others they felt indifferent – no more than a quick glance. One woman stood looking at an acrylic landscape featuring soft morning light coming up over a harbor for quite some time. While others walked past her, she stayed with a soft smile on her face.

The beauty of art is there are so many ways to shape it and to experience it; none of them wrong or bad. And while the paint may dry on a portrait or a landscape, its composition now definitive, the impression it leaves is not so limited. What brings one person peace or joy may be understood or felt differently to another. The meaning an artist held when creating their art may not be the same meaning an audience takes with them. Just as God the artist is beautifully, creatively diverse, so too are God's masterpieces.

This season of Lent, we will journey together through a period of thoughtful reflection, as if we ourselves were a museum and the pieces of our lives, art on its walls. We will be guided by the curriculum "Full to the Brim," a Lenten resource created by the group "A Sanctified Art," who are a group of painters, writers, poets, musicians and theologians.

They write, "Full to the Brim is an invitation—into a radically different Lent, into a full life. It's an invitation to be authentically who you are, to counter scarcity and injustice at every turn, to pour out even more grace wherever it is needed. It disrupts the scarcity mentality that capitalism, oppression, or hierarchy can plant inside of us. When we allow ourselves to be filled to the brim with God's lavish love, that love spills over. It reaches beyond ourselves; like water, it rushes and flows, touching everything in its path."

You will see this theme brought into all life of the church. In our mid-week Lenten services on Wednesdays at 7:00 PM on Zoom, we will use the opportunity of a digital platform to display art and incorporate it into our spiritual practice of reflection and meditation. Come artist, come masterpiece – for that is what God calls you.

In the CAT survey, our members expressed the desire to feel more connected to one another and meaningfully involved with parish life and worship. To address these hopes and pandemic circumstances, the Parish Life Committee has instituted some new opportunities in worship and prayer life.

- Prayer Chaplains: These individuals serve on Sundays to offer up our petitions to God during the worship service. Always uplifted in our hearts and prayers are the specific names offered by members, including saints who have left this earth, and active military members. The leader of the Prayer Chaplains, currently Liz Skinski, prepares the prayers weekly.
- 2. Sharing Joys & Concerns: Pastor Abby has introduced this new moment to worship, as we seek to be intentional and personal in praying for the gathered community each Sunday. This serves as another way for us to deepen connection and relationship with one another. Before the Prayers of Intercession, Pastor Abby will open a time of brief sharing for anyone to speak, where we might pause and be present with the ones around us. The prayer chaplain will not repeat these petitions; but God will hear them and we will share more deeply one another's concerns and joys. You will notice too, that the assembly will be asked to remain seated for the prayers of intercession thereafter.
- 3. Prayer List Updates: We would like the list of names we raise up as a community each Sunday to be as current as possible. Last year we asked members to review the lists and let us know whether the names you had placed on the list could be removed or continue to remain for weekly petitions. Moving forward, we will edit the lists on request and also create new lists every six months; the first Sunday of May and following All Saints Sunday, the first Sunday of November. We will give everyone ample warning to request names remain or be removed at that time.

As we continue to our worship practices, please know we welcome your feedback and suggestions. As it says in our bulletin each week, "wherever you are on your walk with or towards God, you are affirmed, belong and beloved here at St. James. Our community welcomes YOU!" May the "Prayers of the People" be our action in support of these words! All are welcome and embraced.
