Dear Beloved Community,

The ancient Celts had a name for locations where the veil between the spiritual world and physical world narrowed: thin places. Here, sacred resonance is felt much closer and deeper, just by simply entering in. Think of your own experience; where have you walked and suddenly felt, somewhere between your heart and your gut, that you just got nearer to the Holy? Maybe it gave you goosebumps, caused you to pause, or took your breath away.

While working as a hospital chaplain, I was surprised to discover hospital rooms as thin places. These sterile, stark rooms became as intimate as a family's kitchen table. Strangers overlapping briefly and yet such rich conversation about patients' lives, most important moments, relationships, decisions, and conditions. A thin place would start to come to light triangularly between us; myself as chaplain, the patient and God, or however the patient identified that feeling of "Something Greater Than Oneself." I still have profound gratitude for being invited to hold such intimate moments with people I'll never see again. How many strangers do we wait in line with and never know their stories? And yet, into these unassuming hospital rooms and a whole testimony would be offered.

If hospital rooms are thin places, then the ICU family lounge is a chapel. It is a unique space that seems to hover between worlds, where the most eager of prayers are uttered. I have spent a lot of time there, both as a chaplain and as a grieving visitor myself. It is my own theory that one of the characteristics of a thin place is where two seemingly contradictory realities can live together in a divine juxtaposition. An ugliest mess and a strange beauty. Unequivocal anger at God and a desperate dependence on God. The weakest sense of self and the strongest communal love. Grief and gratitude. A place so full and still so thin.

After clocking into the hospital, I would start each day at the ICU family lounge while it was still quiet to say a brief prayer over it. When we enter a thin place together, already possessing the Holy Spirit within us, we are made aware of the thin distance between ourselves and God... and also the thin distance between one another.



Our worship attendance patterns, although steady in the 2010s prior to the pandemic, are in 2022 running 30-40% below those earlier levels. 
