

## A WORD FROM PASTOR

Dear beloved community,

When the service ends, the hymnals return under the chairs, my alb is hung and the laptop closes, I walk the woods. Thule runs freely up the trail while I hang back. It feels good to move in a restful way and be present in the company of fellow creation; as all together, we honor the God that made us. Keeping the Sabbath holy is a command; an invitation that goes beyond attendance at church. Sabbath is a reconnection with God, with the Divine community and all its members including earth. And as I walk, I wonder; about this relationship between faith and earth and the gift of Sabbath. I wander off the trail, through the meadow, and to a new lookout. I wonder beyond our Lutheran path, curious of other perspectives, their meadows and vistas, too.

As continuing education in the last year, I took a few courses through Pacific Lutheran Seminary on community organizing and climate justice. Inspired by the study, I started inviting other local faith leaders to join me on these walks. Together, we explore the relationship between earth, faith, and Sabbath in their tradition - Muslim, Unitarian, Catholic, Jewish, Christian of another name. In each interview, we ventured to a new Southbury Land Trust site, exploring our shared home one trail at a time. We wander and wonder together. We pray with silence and with words. At the end, we check for ticks on our socks, take a deep breath, and say, "This felt good. I'm glad to be here."

And we mean it. Because celebrating Sabbath in communion with ALL creation touches something in our soul that roots us back to the garden where we all started. Because knowing a place or a person takes an unhurried presence and a compassionate curiosity. Because inviting the Spirit that flows through lands and communities and houses of worship as a watershed for all never ceases to nourish, expand, and inspire.

### **Council Members Update**

Thank you to Linda Bedard and Diane Mladjen for completing two, consecutive, three-year terms on Church Council. Most recently, Linda served as Vice-President and Diane as Council Liaison for the Preschool. Additionally, thank you to Emilie Ulc who finished her second one-year term as our Council Youth Representative. We are grateful for their service and contributions to St. James.

Please welcome new Council members, Bill Dreska and Barbara Manville, who were nominated by Church Council and elected at the June annual congregational meeting. Their three-year terms begin June 2023 and run to June 2026.

### Synod Assembly

We three attended the New England Synod Assembly June 9-10, held in the DCU Center, Worcester, MA. It was a wonderful two days. Jam packed plenary sessions, beautiful, handmade guilt displays based on the last words of George Floyd, two dozen display tables highlighting great ministries, and super fellowship and devotions! Also included were eight workshops covering topics ranging from collaboration, economic justice, creating worship which incorporates green practices, and spiritual direction!! Phew - a lot of excitement packed into just two days. The World Hunger team announced the "grand total" of funds collected: BIG HUNGER CHALLENGES, BOLD GENEROUS RESPONSE! Donors of the New England Synod contributed a total of \$132,522.97, which in addition to the \$100k matching funds, means that over \$230k will go to the ELCA World Hunger appeal! Thank you so much to all who contributed! Judy will speak during worship on one of the Workshops: "Economic Justice - The Myth That Made Us" presented by Jeff Fuhrer. Bob will speak about manning the School of Lay Ministry Table, and Lynn will speak on the Anti-Racism presentation which was both most meaningful and so unsettling at the same time. Each one of us can and must combat racism, here and now! We three thank our congregation of St. James for allowing us to represent them as voting members, and experience such a wonderful event with our sisters and brothers of New England Synod!

# SYNOD ASSEMBLY

### ANTI-RACISM RECOMMENDATION

Recommendation to the Synod Council to Enact This Proposal 4/20/2023 From the Antiracism Working Group

WE PROPOSE that the New England Synod Council form an Antiracism Advisory Board, which shall be appointed from member congregations and ministries throughout the Synod. The mission of this Advisory Board will be to direct, foster, and sustain a community for dialogue, reflection, accountability, and action in regards to the work of antiracism and justice. In support of this mission, this Advisory Board shall:

Model what healthy, constructive relationships across race can look like in the church by:

- Providing training resources for Conference Deans, Synod Council, Synod staff, congregations, and other ministries to facilitate conversations and relationships that increase understanding of the impact of one's cultural identity, biases, and to understand intersectionality;
- Engaging with Synod staff and congregations to provide consultation in matters sensitive to race, culture, and its intersectionality with other systems of oppression;
- Encouraging and supporting increased transparency in leadership regarding our involvement and investment in the processes of racism in our synod, states, nation, and in the ELCA;
- Working with the Synod Council and Synod staff to review and ensure compliance with any and all diversity requirements;
- Facilitating learning, dialogue, and action groups and workshops with members from across the New England Synod congregations and ministries.

Illustrate how the work of antiracism is connected to our shared faith in Jesus Christ by:

- Supporting prayer teams that address antiracism and dwell in prayer;
- Sharing and distributing resources that address (anti)racism-including devotionals, confessions, and music-to congregations and other ministries of the New England Synod;
- Holding prayer meetings at least once per month in which all members of the New England Synod are invited to participate.

Integrate antiracism into all decisions and conversations throughout the New England Synod (e.g. Assembly, Synod Council, congregations, other ministries, etc.):

- Reporting regularly to the Synod Council, periodically in Synod communications, and annually to the Synod Assembly;
- The Advisory Board will explore ways antiracism training can be required of Synod Staff and strongly encourage all Rostered Ministers of the New England Synod to receive antiracism training.
- Aiding the New England Synod in answering its baptismal covenant to "seek and serve Christ in all persons...strive for justice and peace among all peoples, and respect the dignity of every human being", and committing to holding congregational and synod leadership accountable to the ongoing Gospel work of antiracism.

AND WE FURTHER PROPOSE that this Advisory Board be given the latitude to discern its structure and goals in harmony with its mission once it is convened.

## Stewardship

It's summertime, and school is out! It's time for being more carefree.... Enjoying pleasant warm summer weather, trips to the beach or the mountains, vacation time, sun and surf, picnics, sunburn and mosquitos (well it's not all fun!). Schedules are less demanding and we can relax for a bit.

But we know time passes quickly. The new St James church Council is getting to work and before you know, it will be Fall and time to think about Stewardship. Neil's presentation at the June congregational meeting reminded us that we are running a deficit budget this year, and that our cash reserves are gradually decreasing. We will need a strong giving effort the rest of this year, and into 2024.

A reminder of the challenge to faithful stewardship can be found in a sermon podcast by Tim Keller, pastor of Grace Presbyterian Church in NYC (who passed away this past May). The sermon was titled "Generosity in Scarcity", preached in 2009 in the midst of the Great Recession. He draws on Habakkuk 3:17-18 (what if we have nothing?), Deuteronomy 26:1-3,10-11 (giving from first fruits) and Matthew 6:19.21 (hearts and our treasures).

His points are that we need to give

## sacrificially, joyfully, and graciously

Let's pray about this challenge as we reflect over the hazy, lazy days of this summer.

Although money is an integral part of our lives, many of us, regardless of age or background, lack a proper understanding of it. We may believe the money problem we face is not having enough. More than likely, however, we have an adequate amount of money but need to use it more wisely. God gives us the freedom to determine how we want to spend money, but the Bible is very clear about what God expects from us. We have an obligation to use what we have according to His plan. Money is good, as are all gifts from God (James 1:17), but because of our sinful state we often use money for wrong and foolish purposes. May we all seek His wisdom and understanding in how to honor the Lord with our money.

During Jesus' last three years on earth, He spent much time nourishing and teaching His disciples. Only when they were prepared to go out into the world to preach, teach, and heal did He send them. Leaving without provisions, the disciples were totally dependent upon those whom the Lord would send them for their support (Luke 9:1-6). The disciples relied upon the power of the Gospel to move the hearts of their listeners who would willingly provide for their needs. They were to travel light and trust in the Lord. Just as the work of the 12 original disciples was funded by other believers, we assist the spreading of the Gospel by supporting today's disciples and missionaries around the world. As we provide for church workers locally and abroad in the name of Jesus, we are serving the Lord Himself - Lynn Morrison
