



# An Apple A Day:

National Heart Month, Hypertension

High blood pressure is called the "silent killer" because it usually doesn't cause any symptoms. If it stays elevated over 130/80 for an extended period it can cause serious

health problems including heart disease, stroke, kidney disease and dementia. There is a simple way to know if you have high blood pressure which is painless. It can be measured with a blood pressure cuff. If you find out you have high blood pressure you can take preventative measures to prevent serious health issues including being disabled and premature death.

Some inherited or life style habits can put you at greater risk for high blood pressure. As we age blood pressure tends to get higher. It does affect younger people too. Before age 50 men tend to have a higher rate of high blood pressure. After age 60 more women than men. African Americans tend to get it at a younger age. Hispanic Cuban, Puerto Rican and Dominican peoples are at higher risk.

Life style risks include excessive dietary salt, drinking too much alcohol, sedentary life style. Watching your weight, staying active and smoking cessation can prevent the complications of high blood pressure. Seek out professional help to set healthy blood pressure numbers for yourself. Your primary care provider can help you to assess your blood pressure, prescribe medication if needed and set those goals to keep you healthy.

2024 Guatemala Mission Trip: Tree4Hope, Guatemala Hope Academy Girl's School Miguel Magone Orphanage

## What hopes do you have for yourself as a trip participant?

Lauren: This has been a huge motivation for me to work on learning some basic conversational Spanish. I hope to be able to engage in some (simple) conversation with the students and staff, to get practice and learn from them to expand my comfort with conversational Spanish. I am looking forward to meeting the child we sponsor and to have a great time hanging out, getting to meet, play and bond with the students.

**Abby:** I am excited because I will be able to see the kids and relate to some of them. I also hope to find a use for the Spanish that I am learning in school.

## What hopes do you have for St James as a congregation?

Lauren: I am excited for St James to have a new physical mission partnership. It is meaningful to financially support an outreach project – it is LIFECHANGING to actually see and meet the faces that are impacted. I can not wait to bring back pictures and stories to make this partnership tangible even for those who were unable to attend the trip.

**Abby:** I am excited for St. James because if you are sending money or writing a check to Tree for Hope, you aren't just sending money to kids, but you know and can relate to the kids there, so you are putting more heart into that.

#### What hopes do you have for St James in this ministry partnership?

**Lauren:** Service trips were a huge part of my growing up years, and, I think, gave me a heart for mission work that extended into my adulthood. I would love to see many more members (especially young people!) have the opportunity to take service trips. Experiencing a different culture, way of life and perspective on the many gifts we enjoy here in the US is a gift I hope many others get to experience. There are few better ways to see how God provides that being out of your comfort zone.

**Abby:** I am excited for St James in this ministry partnership because I hope that more people can go in the years to come. I also think that it would be good for younger kids to go like me because then they can think back to it over the years when they get older.
