

Dear Beloved Community.

There are so many facets to each of our lives; the physical, emotional, mental, social, spiritual, etc. Spirituality involves the recognition of a feeling or sense or belief that there is something greater than oneself alone, something more to being human than sensory experience, and that the greater whole of which we are part is cosmic or divine in nature. About Robertson Spirituality Series "Spirituality for the Nones"



The number of religiously unaffiliated Americans – often called "the nones" – make up a significant portion of the U.S. population, between 20-30%, and that percentage is growing at an ever-increasing rate. These are not people who are necessarily atheists, or simply morally indifferent, or unconcerned with spirituality. In fact, a recent study showed that as many as 72% of the nones believe in God, or a higher power, or a spiritual force. They often yearn and search for the transcendent and seek matters of ultimate concern, just like those in organized religion. At times they describe themselves as "spiritual but not religious." Unfortunately, there seems to be very little spiritual nourishment offered specifically to feed them, nourishment that is thoughtful, credible, meaningful, and tailored to include them as well as spiritual seekers comfortable within an organized religion. It is the goal of the Robertson Spirituality Series to provide provocative and nourishing presentations to seekers from all backgrounds. We hope to provide speakers who come from all faiths and no faith, who will address spirituality's intersection with:

- environmental justice, eco-spirituality, and racial concerns
- the rich tradition of mystical and contemplative devotion throughout world history
- "thin places"
- concerns of health, beauty, harmony, and mortality.

The series will enrich spirituality in a variety of ways, including, but not limited to, lectures, seminars, retreats, book groups, discussions, and trips to sacred places. See hartfordinternational.edu for more information

REPORTS & NEWS

We have some great news to report! The Connecticut Department of Emergency Services & Public Protection has tentatively awarded St. James, under the 2024 Connecticut Nonprofit Security Grant Program. There will be an official Notice of Grant Award package to be sent in the coming weeks.

Our submission for the Security Grant was directed at four significant security improvements:

- Replace current parking lot light poles and lamps with taller poles, LED lights and angled heads. Designed to provide improved lighting and coverage of the entire parking lot.
- Install security cameras around the exterior of the church.
- · Install an alarm system.
- Install keypad access entry system with automatic locking doors.

We all want to personally thank Genie, Jacque, and Meghan and Chris Colasanto for their generous contributions towards submitting this grant. It was a heroic effort and fabulous teamwork by all. We will keep you posted when we hear more!
